**Overview and History of the Michigan State Lottery, presented by Aric Nesbitt, Commissioner
Michigan State Lottery introduced by Ed Sackley.**

Aric grew up on a dairy farm. Appointed by Governor in February. Ninth commissioner of Michigan Lottery. New Hampshire had the first state-sponsored lottery. Great Wall of China was financed by a keno game. Many of the monuments in Washington D.C. were made possible by lotteries. Michigan Lottery established in 1972. All but 6 states have a lottery. Nov 13, 2012, green ticket game began. First million dollar winner was Hermus Millsops, of Taylor, MI. an autoworker who was down on his luck.

All proceeds go to school aid fund. \$21.4 billion to public education since 1972. 2017 was another record year for retailers' commissions, prizes to players, school aid fund, and sales. Out of each dollar,

9¢ to school aid

59¢ to players

9¢ retailer commissions

3¢ administrative costs

Average contribution is \$600 per student.
